General Information

Program Overview

This course is a collaborative project between the ACS Division of Education and the Greek Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. It is a two-day, multi-faceted course meant to provide general surgeons with a review of the essential content areas of general surgery. This represents a commitment to provide the same course outside the USA as initially presented by the American College of Surgeons during its congress in the US.

Venue

The activity is held at the Makedonia Palace Hotel, in Thessaloniki, Greece

Target Audience

The activity is targeted towards general surgeons in practice, surgical residents in training as well as students and health care providers involved in surgical care.

Objectives

The main objective of the course is to spread up-to-date surgical knowledge to as many surgeons as possible in Lebanon and the region. Expert speakers will cover key issues and use a case-based approach to facilitate the translation of the course content into practice. The course is not specifically intended to be a review course in preparation for a certifying or surgery board examination although it may serve that purpose as well.

At the end of this activity, participants will be able to:

1. Recognize signs and symptoms of surgical diseases commonly encountered in general surgical practice and identify the most effective treatment plans.
2. Describe and employ best practices relevant to general surgery through discussion of the general surgery essential content areas and subspecialties.
3. Prevent surgical complications through identification and utilization of safe and effective perioperative treatment guidelines.
4. Formulate and prepare effective treatment plans to optimize patient outcomes and minimize patient risk.
5. Identify proven strategies and techniques in the field of general surgery as well as advances in the field to apply them to current surgical practices.
6. Compare and analyze techniques and evidences in the diagnosis and management of common general surgical diseases and malignancies.
7. Detect guidelines for management of patients with significant comorbid disease.
